

Discover the best of Santiago and its culture. Enjoy the incomparable beauty and charm of Vina del Mar and Valparaiso. Explore and enjoy the fertile wine valley and its famous wineries.

DAY 1: DEPART USA TO SANTIAGO

An overnight non stop flight will take you to Santiago.

DAY 2: SANTIAGO

Welcome to Chile! Upon arrival in Santiago assistance and private transfer to your hotel. In the afternoon enjoy a fully escorted private tour of this cosmopolitan and elegant city with its colonial areas; government buildings, plazas and the panoramic San Cristobal Hill.

OVERNIGHT ACCOMMODATIONS AT SELECTED HOTELS. (B)

DAY 3: SANTIAGO / VINA DEL MAR & **VALPARAISO**

Morning departure from your hotel. The trip takes you thru the fertile valley of Curacaví with its fruit trees and vines, gardens and seascapes and views of unforgetable beauty towards Valparaiso, main port of Chile. The city-port is located in an ample bay surrounded by high hills where the streets, side streets, alleys and scales climb to the summit. A complete view of Valparaiso, its hills, the city, port and the bay can be observed from Baron Hill and its terrace, lights and forged iron gates.

Here we start the visit to Viña del Mar, also known as the "garden city". The Abarca Creek beach located in a well-covered bay is the closest to the city; the clock of flowers; beautiful Libertad Avenue; Corporación Fonck Museum, with its archaeological collection that includes the Mapuche culture and of the Rapa-nui culture of Easter Island.

DAY 4: SANTIAGO & WINERIES

Concha y Toro & Santa Rita Vineyards Morning departure from the hotel. The trip is towards Pirque, bordering the Valley of the Maipo, a zone that includes the most traditional vineyards of Chile - the ideal zone for the production of the most elegant red wines. Tour the famous Concha y Toro Vineyard, founded by Marques de Casa

After visiting Concha y Toro winery we continue South to visit the Santa Rita Winery. Doña Paula restaurant, currently a national monument, was named after Paula Jaraquemada, owner of hacienda Santa Rita's manor house over 200 years ago.

SOUTHERN PATAGONIA HOTEL REMOTA

FIVE DAYS

DAY 1: SANTIAGO / PUNTA ARENAS

Morning transfer from your hotel in Santiago to the airport for fight to Punta Arenas.

DAY 1 – 4: SOUTHERN PATAGONIA

Upon arrival in Punta Arenas, you are met by Remota and transferred to Puerto Natales. Your package includes accommodations, daily Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner menus that include soft drinks and house wine; daily outings and excursions with bilingual (English & Spanish) guide — select from the excursions listed below; use of facilities such as: Sauna, outdoor Jacuzzi and indoor pool.

Remota Patagonia is located in the town of Puerto Natales, in the Seno de Ultima Esperanza province, the best starting place to visit the area. It has a privileged location by the ocean at the starting point of the amazing mountains, lakes and glaciers of the Chilean Patagonia. Located only 158 miles from Punta Arenas and 93 miles from the Torres del Paine national park.

EXCURSIONS

Remota has designed excusions for all types of guests with only the prerequisite of taking in the boundless beauty, listening to the silence and delighting in this majestic scenery that takes us to the inner reaches of our souls. Our guides are fluent in both Spanish and English. The most well known attraction of the area is the Torres del Paine National Park. Located just 2 hours north of Puerto Natales, almost 1000 square miles of breathtaking landscapes declared a Biosphere Reserve. There are also the Milodón Cavern where prehistoric fossils of this herbivore were found, the Balmaceda and Serrano glaciers and the most breathtaking scenery unique to this remote part of the world.





LAKE DISTRICT: PUERTO MONTT,

DAY 1: SANTIAGO / PUERTO MONTT / PUERTO VARAS

Transfer from your hotel to the airport for your flight to Puerto Montt. Transfer to your hotel overlooking the Osorno Volcano and Lake Llanquihue. Puerto Varas is located in the shore of the Llanquihue lake, the third greatest natural lake of South America. In its waters the perfect cone of the Osorno volcano and the tops of the Puntiaguado, Calbuco and Tronador volcanoes are reflected. OVERNIGHT ACCOMMODATIONS AT SELECTED HOTELS. (B)

DAY 2: PUERTO VARAS / OSORNO / PETROHUE FALLS

The tour starts along the border of the Llanquihue Lake with a beautiful view of the volcanoes, passing by Ensenada and stopping for a walk by the Green Lagoon, and continue towards the Petrohue River Falls. A torrent river that runs through stones of peculiar forms and is framed by mountain land-scapes, snow-covered volcanoes, native forests, a great vegetation, in addition to the varied fauna. Continue to the shore of the Todos los Santos Lake or Emerald lake because of its green-blue water color.

DAY 3: PUERTO VARAS / ISLAND OF CHILOE & ANCUD

Today our tour will take you to Pargua, end point with the continent and station of the ferry to cross the Channel of Chacao to Puerto Chacao a small agricultural village and the gate to Chiloé. Continue towards Ancud, with the classic chilota architecture of tiles of wood and its parks and promenades. Visit to the San Antonio Fort (1770) and the Regional Market, with its colorful fair of sea produce and, Huaiquén Hill for a breathtaking panoramic view of the city.

DAY 4: PUERTO VARAS / PUERTO MONT / SANTIAGO

Transfer from your hotel to Puerto Montt for your return flight to Santiago.(B)

FIVE DAYS

DAY 1: PUNTA ARENAS - PUERTO NATALES

Assistance at the airport and transfer to Puerto Natales, passing through the endless Patagonia steppes, crossing trout - filler rivers, beech tree forests, and sheep ranches. Arrive to your hotel in Puerto Natales.

OVERNIGHT ACCOMMODATIONS AT SELECTED HOTELS.

DAY 2: SERRANO AND BALMACEDA GLACIERS

Morning departure for navigation through the Ultima Esperanza fjord, visiting the impressive Serrano and Balmaceda Glaciers. Box lunch included. Sail around the Last Hope Fjord in full view of the Cascades and Sealion Island. Evening return to your hotel in Puerto Natales.

OVERNIGHT ACCOMMODATIONS AT SELECTED HOTELS. (B/L)

DAY 3: TORRES DEL PAINE NATIONAL PARK

Full day excursion to the unforgettable Torres del Paine National Park, a world Biosphere Reserve located Northwest of Puerto Natales. The road borders Figueroa, Sarmiento, Toro and other lakes on the way. Have a glimpse at herds of guanacos, foxes, swan and a variety of small - sized birds. The imposing grandeur of this mountain range, Cuernos (Horns) and Torres del Paine (Towers) is breathtaking. Box lunch included. Afternoon return to Puerto Natales, visiting the Mylodon's Cave on the way, an impressive natural cave where a gigantic prehistoric fossil was discovered. Return to the hotel. OVERNIGHT ACCOMMODATIONS AT SELECTED HOTELS. (B/L)

DAY 4: PUERTO NATALES / PUNTA ARENAS

Morning hike to the base of Torres del Paine Massifs, observing the flora and fauna of this wonderful park. In the afternoon transfer to Puerto Natales and onto Punta Arenas. Reception and transfer to hotel.

OVERNIGHT ACCOMMODATIONS AT SELECTED HOTELS. (B)

DAY 5: PUNTA ARENAS

Morning city tour, starting with a panoramic view of the city and Straits of Magallean from the observation point of La Cruz Hill. Visit the Regional Museum with its magnificent collection of the flora and fauna of the region and relics of the folklore and handicrafts of the native Indian tribes. Visit also the Shepherd's Monument, The Unknown Indian's tomb and the Patagonian Institute with its crossing Garden and Museum. Transfer to airport on time for your departure. (B)

WEDNESDAY DEPARTURES FROM USA NINE DAYS

DAY 1: DEPART USA

Depart on an overnight flight to Chile

DAY 2: ARRIVE SANTIAGO

Morning arrival in Santiago. Assistance and transfer to your hotel. Today, you will enjoy a half day afternoon city tour of "Classic" Santiago. Visit all the city landmarks - the old district with its provincial atmosphere; the sophisticated, European style modern districts of Vitacura, Los Condes and Providencia; the Spanish colonial churches, gardens and government palaces off the Plaza de Armas. Rising above the streets of the capital, savor the panoramic views from the crest of Cristobal Hill.

OVERNIGHT ACCOMMODATIONS AT SELECTED HOTELS.

DAY 3 - FRI: SANTIAGO / PUNTA ARENAS / PUERTO NATALES

Transfer to the airport for the flight to Punta Arenas. On arrival, you are met by Skorpios III staff and transferred with fellow passengers to Puerto Natales. Arrival and embarkation. Welcome drink and dinner on board.

DAY 4 - SAT: TORRES DEL PAINE NATIONAL PARK

This morning visit to the Torres del Paine National Park. This National Park has been declared a Worldwide Biosphere Reserve since 1978. Discover its incredible beauty and walking paths that run through different type of pampas, thick Magellanic forests, and lagoons filled with ice floes. The principal highlight, known worldwide, are the Towers and Horns of Paine. The park has multitude of multi colored lakes such as Nordeskjold, Pehóe, Toro, Sarmiento and Grey; Laguna Azul with its snow capped peaks Grey and Dickson and the Serrano River. Visitors can view impressionable glaciers, all of which are surrounded by gigantic rocks that characterize the silhouette of the Horns of Paine. We shall also visit Milodon Caves. This Natural Monument is made up of three caves and a rock conglomerate. This area offers breathtaking scenery and abundant natural wildlife. Afternoon return to our ship.


SKORPIOS III (B,L,D)

DAY 5 - SUN: SOUTHERN ICE FIELDS AND FJORDS

Early morning, we navigate through the Kirke Narrows, heading towards the North and we anchor in the beautiful spot known as Seno Eyre. While navigating through these canals and fjords we are fascinated with scenery of impressionable contrasts of lights and shades, where the mountains run into a sea that is dotted with Isles; lands furrowed with winds; a region in which the glaciers continue their slow work, pulverizing rocks, plowing out valleys and immense canals. Arrival to the Antrim Fjord.

SKORPIOS III (B, L, D)





DAY 6 - MON: SOUTHERN ICE FIELDS AND FJORDS

This morning, we visit the Pío XI Glacier located at the end of the Eyre Inlet. This glacier is the largest glacier in the southern hemisphere. It is one of the few glaciers that are found in its maximum neo-glacial position. It has registered advances of up to 10 kilometers during recent years. It is here that the M/N Skorpios III closes in on the glacier, navigating through the different sizes and shapes of ice floes and different shares of blue and profoundly impress the visitor. In the early afternoon, the ship proceeds to Puerto Edén, where we disembark and visit this village, located in Wellington Island. Its first inhabitants were the Kaweskar or Alacalufes aborigines. This evening, the ship sets sail from Puerto Edén, navigating through the Paso del Indio and Paso del Abismo.

SKORPIOS III (B, L, D)

DAY 7 - TUE: SOUTHERN ICE FIELDS AND FJORDS

We furrow through the Peel Fjord so as to enter the Calvo Fjord, where we visit six glaciers that seed these quiet waters with colorful and multi-shaped ice floes. Here we take a pleasant excursion in motorboats and have a toast with our tradition of whisky on millennium old glacial ice. The navigation amongst the icebergs is a unique Antarctic phenomenon that is difficult to forget. The motorboats move through this paradise, taking time to visit each "ice sculpture".

Following along the Peel Inlet, we find the Amalia Glacier, situated in the central section of the Ice Fields, its long silhouette appears to be hanging between the peaks of the mountains. This glacier is one of the 48 glaciers that compose the Southern Ice Fields, which are considered to be the third largest reserve of fresh water in the world. In this paradise of natural beauty, the Skorpios III sails in close to the face of the glacier and then moves from the South to the North so the passengers can enjoy the entirety of the glaciers spectacular white splendor.


DAY 8 - WED: SOUTHERN ICE FIELDS AND FJORDS

This morning we are at Montanas Channel. This Fjord gets its name because it is surrounded by enormous mountains, which bring down, all the way to the ocean exuberant flora and trees. We will sail this fjord for almost two hours, passing by Newton Island to get to see three glaciers: Zamudio Glacier, Paredes Glacier and Bernal Glacier. All of these come down gently from the mountains, bringing into the sea their millenary ice. Here we will take a walk through the dense forest to the base of the Bernal Glacier, were we will be able to appreciate its beauty, touch its bluish ice, free from any contamination. This evening, we enjoy a gala farewell dinner.

SKORPIOS III (B. L. D)

DAY 9 - THU: DISEMBARK IN PUERTO NATALES/ PUNTA ARENAS/ SANTIAGO

Disembark this morning. We transfer with our fellow passengers to Punta Arenas, where we board our flight to Santiago. We connect here with our overnight flight out. (B)





SAN PEDRO DE ATACAMA *FOUR DAYS*

The challenging and quiet Desert of Atacama is considered as the driest one of the planet. Mountain ranges, volcanoes, with their eternal snow summits, mysterious geoglyphs, gigantic geysers, impressive salares (salt flats) with their colonies of flamingos, lagoons of intense blue color and thermal water swimming pools in the middle of magical indigenous towns. San Pedro de Atacama is considered as the archaeological capital of Chile and center of the culture of Atacama. Feel the immensity of the Salar de Atacama with the imposing view of the Licancabur volcano, the magic of the quiet Valley of the Moon at dusk, the mystery of the geysers of Tatio and the moving feeling of the Le Paige Archaeological Museum with its collection of objects that illustrate the evolution of the people that inhabited the Atacama territory in its eleven thousand years of development. Easter Island (Rapa Nui)

Remote island located at 3.760 km west from the Chilean coasts. Mystic and overwhelmed with legends; rich in traditions and culture. Famous are the colossal stone statues, of up to seven meters high, known as moai, that are standing with their backs to the Pacific and which origin is still a mystery. There is still no consensus on the origin of its first inhabitants. Whatever the theory may be, the only thing for sure is the fact that the men who built the moais were part of a bierarchic and very religious culture.

Transfer from hotel to airport for flight to Easter Island. Upon arrival to the Mataveri Airport. Assistance and transfer to the hotel.


DAY 2: EASTER ISLAND

Full day excursion visiting the archaeological center of Akahanga, the Rano Raraku volcano and its quarry where almost all the moai that exist were carved, more than 300 statues in different processes of construction and one that is 21 meters high. Ahu Tongariki, where the colossal statues were scattered by the 1960 tidal wave. Ahu Te Pito Kura and Ngau Ngau. Picnic lunch at Anakena beach.

DAY 1: ARRIVE SANTIAGO, CHILE

Welcome to Chile. Upon arrival, you shall be greeted by our country representative, assisted and transferred to your hotel. Santiago, elegant and cosmopolitan capital city, sits in a basin between the Coast Range to the west and the Andes to the East.

This afternoon, enjoy a half day city tour of Santiago. The tour will reveal a sophisticated city of color and contrast; classic city landmarks - the old district with its provincial atmosphere; the sophisticated, European style modern districts of Vitacura, Las Condes and Providencia; the Spanish colonial churches, the Museum of Pre-Colombian Art; the Royal Customs House; gardens and government palaces off the Plaza de Armas. Rising above the streets of the capital, enjoy the panoramic views from the crest of Cristobal Hill, and Santa Lucia. OVERNIGHT ACCOMMODATIONS AT SELECTED HOTELS.

DAY 2: SANTIAGO / WINE COUNTRY / SANTIAGO

The wineries in the valley below Santiago are some of the oldest in Chile. Here you'll find most of the biggest and best-known vineyards in the country. We will visit Maipo Valley, South of Santiago and one of the most recognizable of Chile's wine producing regions.

Chile's largest winemaker, Viña Concha y Toro, is one of the oldest wineries in the region. Imported vines from Europe which significantly improved the quality of the wines produced. Tours begin with an introductory video, a stroll through the vineyards and the century-old gardens, a look at the modern facilities, and a wine tasting experience.

Chile's third-largest winery, Viña Santa Rita, played an important historical role in Chile's battle for independence. At the center of Santa Rita's Maipo Valley estate, the lovely colonial hacienda now serves as the winery's headquarters. Its restaurant, La Casa de Doña Paula, is a delightful place where you shall enjoy lunch, prior to heading down into the winery's musty cellars. You will return back to Santiago later in the afternoon.

DAY 3: SANTIAGO

The day is at leisure to explore Santiago city on your own, or perhaps venture out to the countryside for a day of cultural immersion in Viña del Mar and Valparaiso.

DAY 4: SANTIAGO / PUERTO MONT / PUERTO VARAS

Transfer to the airport for our flight to Puerto Montt, a German-style seaport of fishing boats and water-front cafes. Transfer to your hotel at Puerto Varas, a beauty spot on the shore of Lago Llanquihue in the glaciers area. This afternoon enjoy a tour of the Puerto Varas village, known for its roses growing along the streets and monumental Baroque-style church, a replica of a church in Germany's Black Forest. Continue to Puerto Montt and the fishing port of Angelmo, famed for its crafts market and waterfront cafes.

OVERNIGHT ACCOMMODATIONS AT SELECTED HOTELS. (B)

DAY 5: ANDEAN LAKE CROSSING PUERTO VARAS/

Start this spectacular journey with a departure overland by bus to Petrohué, bordering lake LLanquihue



with a fantastic view of Osorno and Calbuco volcanoes. Here, you will visit Vicente Pérez Rosales National Park which features the emerald green Petrohué Falls. After some free time to stroll around, you depart on a catamaran to Peulla, sailing through Todos Los Santos Lake, enjoying an even more spectacular view of Osorno volcano, Puntiagudo and Tronador hills. Arrival at Peulla, an ecological town and paradise for nature lovers, where you will have the rest of the day at leisure to explore the surroundings on you own.



DAY 6: ANDEAN LAKE CROSSING PEULLA / BARILOCHE, ARGENTINA

Continue your unforgettable experience in natural paradise with an overland journey by bus to Puerto Frias, Argentina. Travel through dense forest and over the Continental Divide to the Chilean/Argentinean Customs Point. Surrounded by the Andes Mountain range, continue down the winding road that leads to Puerto Frías. Sail on Lake Frías to Puerto Alegre. Then drive overland by bus to Puerto Blest. Here you will visit Cántaros Falls. Depart on a catamaran across Lake Nahuel Huapi to Puerto Pañuelo. Upon arrival, board the bus that will take you to the Llao Llao Hotel & Resort.

PATAGONIA CRUISE ADVENTURE ON BOARD THE MARE AUSTRALIS FIVE DAYS

DAY 1: ARRIVE PUNTA ARENAS / EMBARK PATAGONIA CRUISE

Upon arrival in Punta Arenas, you are met and transferred to the Mare Australis check in local office. Afternoon embarkation on the Expedition Cruise Ship Mare Australis. The Captain and crew will give a welcome cocktail reception on board. Immediately afterward, the ship will set sail for the "uttermost part of the earth." Through the mythical Strait of Magellan, we will travel to Southern Patagonia, including Tierra de Fuego. This is the beginning of a Great Adventure!

ABOARD MARE AUSTRALIS (B, D)

DAY 2: PATAGONIA CRUISE (AINSWORTH BAY / TUCKER ISLET)

During the dawn's early light, your ship will continue navigating through Almirantazgo Inlet, until arriving near Marinelli Glacier in Ainsworth Bay, where you will enjoy a walk to discover a beaver dam in the midst of a marvelous Magellanic forest. On the beach, observe a colony of Elephant Seals. Continuing the voyage, visit Tucker Islet, where you will see colonies of Magellanic penguins and Cormorants from the zodiac boats.

ABOARD MARE AUSTRALIS (B, L, D)

DAY 3: PATAGONIA CRUISE (PIA GLACIER / GLACIER ALLEY)

You will navigate the main part of the Beagle Channel to enter Pia Fjord and disembark near the glacier of the same name. Take an excursion to a look-out point that is ideal for viewing the mountain range where the glacier originates. After this unforgettable experience, sail again along the northwest arm of the Beagle Channel through majestic "Glacier Alley": Spain, Romanche, Germany, Italy, France and Holland glaciers.

ABOARD MARE AUSTRALIS (B, L, D)

DAY 4: PATAGONIA CRUISE (CAPE HORN AND PUERTO WILLIAMS)

Sail through the Beagle and Murray Channels to disembark in Cape Horn National Park. Cape Horn, a sheer, almost 425-meter-high promontory, where the Atlantic and Pacific Ocean merge. The Cape owes its name to the Port of Horn, the expedition's departure point. In the afternoon, disembark in Port Williams, the southernmost town in the world, where you can take optional excursions, such as the visit to Martin Gusinde Museum.

ABOARD MARE AUSTRALIS (B, L, D)

DAY 5: DISEMBARK PATAGONIA CRUISE / USHUAIA, ARGENTINA

Arrival to Ushuaia, the most important Argentine city in Tierra de Fuego, and the southernmost city in the world. Disembark at 8:00AM. You will be met at the pier and transferred to the airport for your flight to Buenos Aires. (B)

TWELVE DAYS

DAY 1: ARRIVE SANTIAGO, CHILE

Welcome to Chile. Upon arrival, you shall be greeted by our country representative, assisted and transferred to your hotel. Santiago, elegant and cosmopolitan capital city, sits in a basin between the Coast Range to the west and the Andes to the East.

This afternoon, enjoy a half day city tour of Santiago. The tour will reveal a sophisticated city of color and contrast; classic city landmarks - the old district with its provincial atmosphere; the sophisticated, European style modern districts of Vitacura, Las Condes and Providencia; the Spanish colonial churches, the Museum of Pre-Colombian Art; the Royal Customs House; gardens and government palaces off the Plaza de Armas. DAY 2: SANTIAGO / WINE COUNTRY / SANTIAGO

The wineries in the valley below Santiago are some of the oldest in Chile. Here you'll find most of the biggest and best-known vineyards in the country. We will visit Maipo Valley, South of Santiago and one of the most recognizable of Chile's wine producing regions.

Chile's largest winemaker, Viña Concha y Toro, is one of the oldest wineries in the region. Imported vines from Europe, significantly improving the quality of the wines produced. Tours begin with an introductory video, a stroll through the vineyards and the century-old gardens, a look at the modern facilities, and a wine tasting experience.

DAY 3: SANTIAGO / PUERTO MONTT / PUERTO VARAS

Transfer to the airport for our flight to Puerto Montt, a German-style seaport of fishing boats and water-front cafes. Transfer to your hotel at Puerto Varas, a beauty spot on the shore of Lago Llanquihue in the glaciers area. This afternoon enjoy a tour of the Puerto Varas village, known for its roses growing along the streets and monumental Baroque-style church, a replica of a church in Germany's Black Forest. Continue to Puerto Montt and the fishing

port of Angelmo, famed for its crafts market and waterfront cafes.

DAY 4: ANDEAN LAKE CROSSING PUERTO VARAS/ PEULLA

You start your spectacular journey with a departure overland by bus to Petrohué, bordering lake LLanquihue with a fantastic view of Osorno and Calbuco volcanoes. Here, you will visit Vicente Pérez Rosales National Park which features the emerald green Petrohué Falls. After some free time to stroll around, you depart on a catamaran to Peulla, sailing through Todos Los Santos Lake, enjoying an even more spectacular view of Osorno volcano, Puntiagudo and Tronador hills. Arrival at Peulla, an ecological town and paradise for nature lovers, where you will have the rest of the day at leisure to explore the surroundings on you own.

This schedule is referential. Weather conditions may cause changes in the schedule. Collective tour with other guests.

DAY 5: ANDEAN LAKE CROSSING / PEULLA / BARILOCHE

Continue your unforgettable experience in natural paradise with an overland journey by bus to Puerto Frias, Argentina. Travel through dense forest and over the Continental Divide to the Chilean/Argentinean Customs Point. Surrounded by the Andes Mountain range, continue down the winding road that leads to Puerto Frías. Sail on Lake Frías to Puerto Alegre. Then drive overland by bus to Puerto

Blest. Here you will visit Cántaros Falls. Depart on a catamaran across Lake Nahuel Huapi to Puerto Pañuelo. Upon arrival, board the bus that will take you to the Llao Llao Hotel & Resort, Golf-Spa, located in the northwest of the Argentine Patagonia and within Nahuel Huapi National Park. It is surrounded by majestic mountain peaks, crystal blue lakes, snow-covered mountains, rivers and colorful forests of Larch, Cypress, Coihue and Arrayanes.

The capital offers something for everyone, from sophisticated European-style architecture, gardened parks and broad boulevards, pulsating tango nightlife and unique local neighborhoods of great character and charm.

DAY 8: BUENOS AIRES

Today you'll enjoy a half day tour of one of the most sophisticated and charming cities of the Americas. This tour starts at the historical May Square (Plaza de Mayo) surrounded by the Government House (Pink House), the Metropolitan Cathedral and the ancient City-Hall, seat of the former Spanish Viceroys. Continuation along May Avenue, of strong Spanish influence till you get to Congress Square facing the





National Parliament. Drive along the main streets and avenues around downtown and the most fashionable districts of the city and the spacious and oxygenating Palermo Parks for a relaxing stroll. Your tour will also include the bohemian and colorful neighborhood of La Boca -of Italian immigrants- and the elegant district of Recoleta.

This evening, you will get in close contact with the sensual music and dance of Tango, Argentina's major cultural export, accompanied by dinner.

DAY 9: BUENOS AIRES

The day is at leisure for you to enjoy the city's distinguished museums or world-class shopping. An array of optional tours is available which can be arranged locally through our representatives. We recommend a full day excursion dedicated to the visit of an estancia in the Pampas, a typical Argentine ranch, ideal place to appreciate the Argentine gaucho skills in cattle breeding and horseback riding, plus a typical Argentine barbecue, the "asado". Or perhaps, a half day tour to the Tigre Delta. Tigre is an exclusive resort of summer residences, yachting and rowing clubs. Here you can enjoy a boat ride through the rivers and streams of the Parana-Delta to view hundreds of islands covered in luxuriant vegetation.

DAY 10: BUENOS AIRES / IGUASSU FALLS

OVERNIGHT ACCOMMODATIONS AT SELECTED HOTELS. (B)

Transfer to the airport to fly to Iguassu Falls. You are met on arrival and transferred to your hotel. Long before the Spanish explorer Don Alvaro Nuñes reached South America's greatest waterfall in 1541, the local Indians had named it Iguacu - meaning

great waters. Once seen, the falls - all 275 of themare never forgotten. The two-mile wide curtain of water crashing 300 ft over a series of precipices into a spray-filled gorge constitutes the most spectacular sight of probably the whole of South America.

This afternoon, enjoy a walking tour of the falls from the Brazilian side. Cross the border into Brazil and proceed into the national park. A trail winds towards the falls populated by contis, long-tailed racoon-like creatures. At its end, an elevator provides speedy access to a viewing platform at the foot of the falls. Focal point of the falls, best seen from above, is the Devil's Throat, a horseshoe-shaped gully in midstream, over which seems to pour most of the Iguassu River.

DAY 11: IGUASSU FALLS

Explore the falls from the Argentine side either by riding the train or by talking an easy walk along Sendero Verde (green trail). Both ways will get you to Cataratas Station, the starting point of the Upper Circuit. The Upper Circuit is a half-hour walk along a 1200-meter trail - with low degree of difficulty and no stairs - that goes deep into the jungle. All of a sudden, you run into breathtaking views of the Falls. You will get lots of closer views at the different observation points, and more panoramic sights toward the end of the trail. The Lower Circuit requires more physical effort due to its stairs but it can be perfectly done if you take it nice and slow, catching your breath on the different viewpoints. On this trail you will also walk deep into the jungle, crossing streams and coming across local fauna. The Lower Circuit goes all the way down to the river, where the boat crosses over to San Martin Island. On the way down, there are balconies with marvelous bottom-up views




of the Falls. The second leg of the train ride leaves from Cataratas Station and goes to Garganta del Diablo Station.

The morning is at leisure to explore the area further on your own. In the afternoon, you transfer to the airport for your flight back to Buenos Aires. Upon your arrival, you will be transferred from the domestic airport to International airport for your outbound flight. (B)





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
